On The High Road **BUILT BY ALUMNI**

Notre Dame Alumni have been a “driving” force on the road to improvement of our facilities, our grounds and our academics for the past 5 years in unique and inspirational ways. The ingenuity and generosity of so many alumni has set Notre Dame on a growth trajectory that is unprecedented!

Alumni who have contributed their time, talent and treasure to the success of our annual gala, have seen the fruits of their efforts grow exponentially. The profit from each of the galas for the past five years has been designated largely to financial aid for families who desire a Catholic education (enrollment is at an all-time high!), and also to many upgrades to our existing facilities, as well as to investment in new facilities. The enthusiastic support of alumni, families, faculty and staff is evident in our buildings, our events and our students’ successes.

The most prominent change on campus is our new Alumni Center, which opened in 2022. A vision for many years, it was recently brought into focus by an alumnus who amplified that vision. He led the way, initiating and embarking on the construction project that would become our new auditorium for use by Notre Dame students, and would also serve as a welcoming site and source of pride for Alumni to gather for events. Following his lead and inspired by his passion for Notre Dame, other alumni soon bought into that vision.

Notre Dame now boasts a spectacular 19,000 square foot auditorium that houses seating for over 600, an approximately 1,500 sq. foot stage with 2 dressing rooms backstage, luxurious stage curtains, a projector and screen, a sacristy, a bandroom, a state-of-the-art sound system, a spacious lobby (large enough to host school events and class reunions) and an elevator to provide access

The campus ministry is spreading the “WORD”

Campus Ministry has been full of life and growth this school year, and continues to seek to develop meaningful relationships with our students and families under the guidance of our new Chaplain, Fr. Guernsey Isaac and Campus Ministry Coordinator, Mrs. Zelenda Hodgskin.

In our mission to enrich the spiritual lives of our students, many new retreats have been added from which students can choose. Visits to local shrines, including inspiring destinations such as Our Lady of Czestochowas Shrine in Doylestown and the National Padre Pio Center in Barto and Our Lady of Lourdes Shrine at Mount St. Mary's and John Paul II Shrine in Washington D.C. offer time for reflection and introduce students to ways to connect with God through the lives of saints.

A 4-day “Kairos” retreat is offered to Seniors in the Fall and in the Spring. Held at the Loyola Jesuit Center in Morristown NJ., the Kairos retreatants are afforded 4 days of a guided retreat where they spend time reflecting on their lives, learn how to build their relationships with God and with others, and learn how to carry their faith forward as they move on to adulthood.

Crusader Band celebrates expanded membership, boasts busy schedule of upcoming events

Upon Mr. Klump’s arrival in April 2023, he was met by a group of 17 students who had been without a director for several months, but were unhampered in their enthusiasm as they inched forward on their own with plans to stage a spring performance. With their new band director guiding them, the students took great pride in their preparation and performance that culminated in a successful formal band

concert, the first in several years.

Eager to leverage that enthusiasm, Mr. Klump quickly created plans for expansion. The goals for 2023-24 were three-fold:

(1) to foster continued student leadership and accountability by appointing student officers; (2) to revive the marching band program, which had been dormant since the pandemic; and (3) to increase the visibility of the program, both at school and in the community.

This past summer, band members volunteered countless hours customizing the band room in our new auditorium, refinishing instrument cabinets and installing uniform racks and shelving. Our new band room is equipped with two sound-proofed practice rooms and a sound system that allows for music to be heard from the bandroom to the stage.

To those ends, the band performs at both home and away football games, is marching in local parades year-round, supporting winter sports teams as a pep band, performing in concert with student musicians from our partner schools, and planning an overnight trip to Cleveland to tour and perform at the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame! The Crusader band is back - growing and thriving exponentially!


Salute to Veterans and Scholarship Presentation: NDHS VETERAN'S MASS

Each November, Notre Dame High School celebrates a Mass honoring Alumni Veterans. This heartfelt gathering of Alumni, friends of Notre Dame, students, faculty and staff honors and recognizes veterans for their service to our country. Following the Mass, an award is presented to the selected "Alumni Veteran of the Year".

On November 20, 2023, the Notre Dame community was proud to honor Colonel Joseph Herkalo, a member of the Notre Dame High School class of 1964, as 2023 Alumni Veteran of the Year.

A proud graduate of Notre Dame, Col. Herkalo played basketball, baseball and football during his years as a Notre Dame student.

After high school, he earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Moravian College and a master's degree from Lehigh University. He returned to his alma mater to teach Social Studies from 1968 through 1977. Mentoring students through his teaching and through coaching basketball,



baseball and football, his legacy of service continued through the generations.

His service to Veterans has remained a passion, and as the current Commander of American Legion Post 379 in Bethlehem, he continues to assist fellow veterans. He is a member of the Honor Guard and actively participates in Veteran ceremonies and celebrations throughout the year.

Immediately following the Alumni Veteran award presentation, a deserving student is awarded the Patrick Mullins Memorial Scholarship.

Patrick Mullins was a Notre Dame alumnus (class of 1964) who lost his life in a helicopter crash while on a heroic mission during the war in Vietnam. He received the Silver Star posthumously for his heroism. His twin brother, Michael (class of 1964), who also served during the Vietnam war, presents the scholarship award.

CHOOSE HOW YOUR TAX DOLLARS ARE SPENT?**

What is this program?

- You can create a \$5,000 scholarship for only \$500 and 100% of your contribution goes directly to Notre Dame High School.
- Through the Educational Improvement Tax Credit Program (EITC) and Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit Program (OSTC) individuals can direct their tax dollars to help educate deserving students.

How can a business participate?

- Determine if your business pays one of the following taxes:
 - > Corporate Net Income Tax
 - > Capital Stock Franchise Tax
 - > Bank and Trust Company Shares Tax
- All Sub-Chapter S corporations and other "pass through" entities (LLC, LLP, and other partnerships) whose members pay personal income tax on PA business income can benefit by participating as an individual.


